What is NEWT?



NEWT stands for Newbury Environment and Wildlife Team. The trustees have been involved with environmental projects for decades and are passionate about what we do. We have relationships with local landowners to improve habitat and bio-diversity. We run work parties on our projects with volunteers and also volunteer our services to other community groups to help on their own projects, such as running hedge-laying courses.
