We run our own wildflower projects, but also collaborate with other local organisations with their wildflower projects. We offer help and advice for planning your project. Buying seed in bulk is much cheaper, so we can sometimes arrange bulk purchases for a group of different projects. We are currently saving up for a tractor and flail so we can manage larger projects at our Northcroft nature reserve.

A simple and very effective way of contributing to nature

These crucial habitats have become marginalised and degraded, putting pressure on the species that rely on them; that we in turn rely on for our own food!



Meadow planning

It sounds very simple, throw seeds on soil, wait for flowers. But all to often projects can fail due to the wrong species being selected for the location, or perhaps more importantly, what they will be competing against. Done properly an established meadow should need little maintenance and continue to flourish for years to come. Sometimes no seeding is required at all, and simple management techniques can quickly create stunning results.
